# Company director and his companies taken to task for Companies Act and Income Tax offences

A company director was convicted and fined \$16,800 for failing to hold AGMs and file Annual Returns for 16 of his companies. Four of his companies were fined for failing to file their corporate income tax returns. He was also disqualified as director of all companies that he has been appointed to and from taking on new appointments.
