- New requirements from regulators – Governance Code, AML, BEPS
- New rules from professional bodies eg Accounting Standards, Taxation
- Others

# FUNCTIONS & RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE AC CHAPTER

- Platform for AC Members
- Develop thought leadership and advocacy with stakeholders

- Initiate and organize activities

# WHAT IS AC PITSTOP?

- A series of talks and seminars organised by the AC chapter
- Addresses relevant and topical AC matters
- Led by experts in their fields
- Short duration usually 2 to 3 hours conducted in the morning
- Small to mid class size – average 30 to 40 attendees
- Interactive and lively sessions

# AC PITSTOP

- Started in 2017
- 13 runs - talks and seminars
- Approximately 500 attendances
- 5 sessions planned for 2019
